Cross-border education; digitalisation; recognising prior learning - challenges discussed at ENIC-NARIC networks AGM

UK NARIC was in Bregenz, Austria, for the 22nd ENIC-NARIC networks meeting on 7-9 June, jointly organised by the European Commission, the Council of Europe, UNESCO, and ENIC-NARIC Austria in collaboration with the Region Vorarlberg.

The challenges for recognition in the context of MOOCs, blended learning, digitalisation, formal, and informal/non-formal learning were considered by the networks.

Workshops addressed topics including cross-border and transnational education, the recognition of prior learning, and strengthening the links between recognition and quality frameworks and quality assurance.

UK NARIC CEO Dr Cloud Bai-Yun, alongside colleagues from NOKUT Norway, presented a workshop on the evaluation of refugees' credentials in a turbulent world.

Brazil, Colombia in exploratory talks to streamline recognition processes

UK NARIC has met with visiting delegations from Brazil and Colombia as the Latin American countries explore ways to streamline their recognition processes.

The delegations included representatives of universities and the ministries of education and the visits, which included meetings with UK universities, were coordinated by the British Council. At the moment, Brazil and Colombia use content-based recognition processes: educators in those countries examine the content of the overseas curriculum and map that to their domestic qualifications to find an equivalence.

The UK's contrasting outcome-focused recognition approach was discussed and debated. There was interest in how UK NARIC's data banks on education systems, institutions and qualifications were kept up-to-date. (more...)
